Minutes of the Liquor Control Commission

The Liquor Control Commission of the McLean County Board met on Tuesday, June 21, 2016 at 10:30 a.m. in Room 404, Government Center, 115 E. Washington Street, Bloomington, Illinois.

Chairman McIntyre called the meeting to order 10:30 a.m.

Chairman McIntyre stated that the first item for action is approval of the June 19, 2015 Liquor Control Commission Meeting Minutes.

Motion by Metsker/Cavallini to recommend approval of the June 19, 2015 Liquor Control Commission Meeting Minutes.

Motion carried.

Chairman McIntyre presented the Request for Approval of the Annual Liquor License Renewals for 2016-2017. He referred to the list of applicants along with a description of the different classes of liquor licenses.

Mr. Wendt asked if there have been any problems with any of the 2015-2016 licenses or any reason the licenses should not be renewed. Mr. Don Knapp, First Assistant State's Attorney, Civil, responded that the Sheriff pays particular attention to the Danvers Y due to their past violations. He is not aware of any recent violations..

Mr. Knapp stated that he has reviewed all of the applications that were filed with the McLean County Clerk. He noted that 12 Annual Liquor Licenses were issued in 2015-2016. All twelve license holders have filed for renewal. There were six Outdoor Garden Licenses issued in 2015-2016. All six license holders have filed for renewal. He added that Ms. Jessica Woods worked with the Hofmanns at White Oak Vineyards concerning the class of license applied for. Mr. McIntyre noted that he and Mr. Chuck Erickson also met with the Hofmanns.

Mr. Soeldner asked if the County has seen an increase in any costs related to the video gaming licensing. Mr. Knapp responded that he is not aware of any increased costs to the County related to video gaming. He advised that we can look into additional costs and report to the Committee.

Mr. Wendt asked if the County receives any revenue from the video gaming in the County. Mr. Knapp responded that the County does receive revenue for video gaming, however it is minimal.

Chairman McIntyre advised that the largest percentage of the revenue goes to the State. Mr. Soeldner added that the operator get 1/3, the owner of the bar gets 1/3, the State gets 1/3 and the municipality gets 5% of the State's 1/3.

Ms. Metsker noted that the American Legion is not listed as having video gaming. The County Clerk's office will be notified to keep the Liquor License spread sheet up to date. They will contact the license holders to determine who has video gaming and the number of machines they have.

Mr. Knapp assured the Committee that all the applications received are in order with license fees paid and all documentation papers in order. Current licenses will expire June 30, 2016. Mr. Knapp recommended the approval of the following 2016-2017 County Liquor Licenses:

6. Mary English, Hurley Enterprises Inc. Crestwicke Corp dba Crestwicke Country Club – Class A and Outdoor Garden
7. Larry Kelly, K M B & G Inc. dba Kelly's Merna Bar & Grill – Class A
8. Brian Matlock, LeRoy Country Club – Class A and Outdoor Garden
9. Suketu Trividi Inc. dba Bloomington Fast Stop – Class A
10. Frank Sutter, Indian Springs Recreation Association – Class A and Outdoor Garden
11. Rudolph & Mary Hofmann, White Oak Vineyards, Inc. – Class B, and Outdoor Garden
12. David L. Turnis, American Legion Louis E. Davis Post 56, Inc. – Class B

In addition to the regular premise license, six establishments have re-applied for a Class "G" Outdoor Garden license. Those establishments are:

3. Hazy Hills Golf Course
4. LeRoy County Club
5. Graybill Limited dba Lake Road Inn
6. White Oak Vineyard

Mr. Knapp recommended approval of the renewal applications for a Class "G" Outdoor Garden license as well.

Motion by Soeldner/Cavallini to recommend approval of the Annual Liquor License Renewals for 2016-2017.
